Scottish Whisky *All Served in measures of 25ml.*

Chivas Regal 12 40% 4.90

Wild herbs, heather, honey and orchard fruits on the nose, round and creamy on the palate.

Glenmorangie Original 40% 5.50

Citrus and ripe peaches on the nose, softened with a hint of vanilla on the tongue, bringing a burst of flowery fruitiness.

Glenfiddich 12 Year Old 40% 5.50

The distillery's signature single malt Scotch whisky has matured for at least 12 years in American and Spanish oak casks. All are individually tended by experienced on-site coopers. The whisky develops complex, elegant flavours with notes of fresh pear and subtle oak.

Highland Park 12 Year Old 40% 5.50

Medium bright gold in colour, a sweet 'come hither' nose with sherry and marzipan. Fruity, rich and sweet on the palate showing great depth. Smoky hints on the finish that fade gently into the background.

Johnnie Walker Black Label 40% 4.90

Robust and forceful, the peaty smoke is at the fore on the palate but also dried fruits sherry and vanilla. Never unbalanced – Power with discretion.

Caol Ila 12 Year Old 43% 6.80

This little-known distillery produces complex, smoky and oily-textured malts.

This one has nuances of seaweed, juniper, olives and peaty dryness.

Laphroaig 10 Year Old 40% 6.20

Best savoured neat, or with a little cool water. Roll it around on your tongue.

Release the pungent, earthy aroma of blue peat smoke and the nuttiness of the barley.

Lagavulin 16 Year Old 43% 9.10

Massive, peat-smoke typical of southern Islay, yet with a dry finesse that makes up a classy package. A worthy classic.

Talisker 10 Year Old 45.8 % 6.00

Surprises with some sweetness, then fruits, smoke and seaweed.

Lots to give on the finish with the sweetness coming back and a distinctive sharp pepper bite. Good with oysters or smoked salmon.

Irish and Imported Whiskeys *All served in measures of 25ml.*

Jameson Irish Whiskey (Ireland) 40% 4.50

The nose offers an interesting combination of floral, orange, toffee, sherry and spice notes. Water releases more cooked fruits and a suggestion of linseed. Initially citric in the mouth, along with classic Irish oiliness, more profound notes of sherry develop, along with fudge, vanilla and spice. The finish is long, warm and spicy, remaining oily to the very end. Jameson is deservedly a world leader.

Original Old Bushmills (Ireland) 40% 4.50

The cornerstone of the Blackbush family, it's a blend of their own triple distilled malt whiskey with a lighter Irish grain whiskey. Making it an approachable whiskey with a rich warming taste of fresh fruit and vanilla.

Bushmills Black Bush Special (Ireland) 40% 4.90

A combination of a uniquely high proportion of malt whiskey matured in former Oloroso Sherry casks with a sweet, batch-distilled grain whiskey. This unique recipe gives Black Bush it's rich fruity notes and intense character.

Nikka Miyagikyo (Japan) 45% 6.70

Crafted in Nikka's second distillery in the mountains of Sendai. Nikka use less peaty malt and pot still using indirect steam to form a beautiful single malt which is light in body and yet full in flavour. This is the perfect entry into the rewarding world of Japanese Whisky.

Jack Daniel's Old No 7 (USA) 40% 4.90

Tennessee whiskey is like bourbon but is different in that it is filtered through maple charcoal in large wooden vats prior to aging.

Tennessee whiskey is also not subject to the regulations relating to bourbons, such as the use of new barrels and low level of distilling proof.

Jim Beam (USA) 40% 4.90

American as apple pie and a testament to quality, tradition and passion, Jim Beam is the best-selling brand of bourbon in the world. Seven generations of craftsmanship go into every bottle.

Woodford Reserve (USA) 43.2% 5.60

The colour of dark honey, this fine bourbon whiskey is rich and warm with layers of mint, tobacco, leather and fruit. Smooth and full-bodied.

Maker's Mark (USA) 45% 5.50

An amber-coloured bourbon with spice and tropical fruits on the nose. Medium to full-bodied, with ginger spice, caramel and a mouth-watering oiliness to the palate.
